#### SCHEDULES

##### **Definition**

**1** In this regulation, "**Class 1 milk**" means fluid milk that is homogenized milk, 2% milk, 1% milk, skim milk or 2% chocolate milk.

##### **Container sizes**

**2** Unless prior written permission is obtained from the Commission, no manufacturer, processor, jobber or distributor shall sell Class I milk to any person except in a container of one of the following sizes:

- (a) 114 millilitre;
- (b) 250 millilitre;
- (c) 500 millilitre;
- (d) 1 litre;

- (e) 2 litre;
- (f) 4 litre;
- (g) 10 litre;
- (h) 20 litre.

**Areas**

**3** For the purposes of this order, the following are designated as areas:

- (a) the area within the boundaries of the City of Winnipeg, to be called "the Winnipeg area";
- (b) [repealed] M.R. 246/90;
- (c) [repealed] M.R. 90/92;
- (d) the area within the boundaries of the City of Brandon, to be called "the Brandon area".

**Wholesale prices**

**4** The maximum prices set out in Schedule A are those at which homogenized milk, 2% milk, 1% milk and skim milk in one litre containers shall be sold if

- (a) the sale takes place in an area referred to in section 3; and
- (b) the sale is made by a manufacturer, processor, jobber or distributor to any purchaser, other than a jobber, consumer or restaurant operator.

**Rural transportation differentials**

**5** Where Class I milk, as described in section 4, is sold for delivery outside an area referred to in section 3, the prices established under section 4 shall be increased by the applicable rural transportation differential as set out in Schedule B.

**6** Manitoba Regulation 43/88, as amended, is repealed.

**Coming into force**

**7** This regulation comes into force on May 1, 1989.

**Maximum wholesale prices**

**1** Maximum wholesale prices for sales to purchasers other than jobbers, consumers or restaurant operators of the following types of Class 1 milk in a 1 litre container are as follows:

TYPE OF CLASS 1 MILK	MAXIMUM PRICE FOR A 1 LITRE CONTAINER
Homogenized Milk	\$1.56
2% Milk	\$1.49
1% Milk	\$1.43
Skim Milk	\$1.39

**WRAP add-on included**

**2** Each maximum price listed in section 1 includes a one-cent WRAP add-on to provide a mechanism for processors to recover environmental stewardship fees paid in accordance with approved plans under *The Waste Reduction and Prevention Act* and its regulations.

**RURAL TRANSPORTATION DIFFERENTIALS**

**1** TRANSPORTATION DIFFERENTIALS FOR DISTANCES UP TO AND INCLUDING 210 KILOMETERS FROM DESIGNATED AREAS:

The following differentials apply with respect to all designated areas referred to in section 3 of the regulation:

<b>Distance from nearest designated area</b>	<b>Differential per litre (Non-Cumulative)</b>
30 kilometers or less	2 cents
over 30 kilometers, up to and including 60 kilometers	3 cents
over 60 kilometers, up to and including 90 kilometers	4 cents
over 90 kilometers, up to and including 120 kilometers	5 cents
over 120 kilometers, up to and including 150 kilometers	6 cents
over 150 kilometers, up to and including 180 kilometers	7 cents
over 180 kilometers, up to and including 210 kilometer	8 cents

**2** TRANSPORTATION DIFFERENTIAL FOR DISTANCES EXCEEDING 210 KILOMETERS FROM DESIGNATED AREAS:

- (a) Where the nearest designated area is the Winnipeg area, the following differential applies:

<b>Distance from Winnipeg area</b>	<b>Differential per litre</b>
over 210 kilometers, up to and including 240 kilometers	8 cents

(b) Where the nearest designated area is the Brandon area, the following differential applies:

<b>Distance from Brandon area</b>	<b>Differential per litre</b>
over 210 kilometers, up to and including 360 kilometers	8 cents
